**Hematopoietic Stem Cell Transplantation for New Onset Type 1 Diabetes**

This lecture will focus on the effects of the autologous nonmyeloablative hematopoietic stem cell transplantation (HSCT) in patients with type 1 diabetes mellitus.

Dr. Burt is board certified in internal medicine and medical oncology.

**Importance of Mineral Cosmetics\* (Non-CME)**
