## upus researchers ll, then revamp ulty immune systems

HICAGO — Lupus, an incurand sometimes fatal disease turns victims' immune systems inst them, has proved vulner-to a new radical approach that troys and then revives the y's natural defenses, doctors vesterday.

24-year-old woman dangerly ll with the disease shows no signs of lupus two months after the treatment, said Dr. Richard Burt at Northwestern Memorial Hospital.

Heather Markel, whose condition worsened recently after 13 years of treatment with steroids and chemotherapy, is the first patient to receive the treatment, Burt said.

Burt and others cautioned that it is still early for 2 definitive answer, because the disease is characterized by active and inactive periods.

The new process takes stem cells, which grow into bone marrow cells, a foundation of the immune sys-

tem, from a patient's blood and purifies them. Intense chemotherapy destroys the patient's immune system and then the purified cells are returned to blossom and recreate the immune system.

But destroying the immune system exposes patients to other dangers, so for now only the most severely afflicted lupus patients, or about 1 percent, should receive the treatment, Burt said.
